Pick Up Run

There is some confusion on how our pick up runs are organised. Our published depart times are always for Bradford, Nelson Street. It then depends wether the times are for an 'A Run' or a 'B Run'.

A stands for AFTER Bradford.

B stands for BEFORE Bradford.

So if your trip is a B run, all times will be before the stated time with Bradford Being the last pick up.

If your trips is an A run, all times will be after the stated time, with Bradford being the first pick up. Our pick up to/from Bradford, starts or finishes at Keighley, and takes around 45 minutes and we hope we can meet up at convenient points with many bus services, be near train services, plus with free car parking offered at our premises, give good coverage for a reasonable amount of pick up time.

We have been complemented on may on many occasions that once you are on our coach you are quickly on your way for the trip, and not trailing round for hours loading up. We have been asked for years why don't we pick up in Skipton, Ilkley, Otley, Cleckheaton, Huddersfield, Halifax, Brighousewith a geographical spread like that we'd lose the very thing we are complimented for.



Child Prices - Day Trip

If you haven't noticed we offer a £5 discount for children aged between 4 to 14 years of age travelling on our day excursions. This is to help with the cost of perhaps taking either your own child or grand children on a day out

especially during the school holidays. All children must be accompanied by a responsible adult. (Discount applies unless otherwise stated).



Covid Protocols (At Present)

In light of the continuing pandemic, and despite the vaccination programme, we still have procedures in place to help protect everybody who travel with us or visit our office. We adhere at all times with the current guidance. If anybody feels unwell and has Covid symptoms, please book a PCR test and stay at home as per Government guidance.

We require face coverings to be worn at all times on the coaches, and in the office – unless you are medically exempt.

Hand sanitiser is available and recommended to use on the coaches and in the office.

The coaches have anti-viral filters fitted in the air conditioning systems, which are set to fresh air intake (as opposed to re-circulated air), and their common touch areas eg handrails, are cleaned with anti viral products. If somebody is travelling alone then we will not sit anybody unknown from another household next to them. As rules and regulations change we keep abreast of such matters through updates from our trade association (Confederation of Passenger Transport), and take part in regular webinar and zoom meetings.

Please also note itineraries that we publish may still be affected by restrictions imposed not only by Governments, but attraction operators themselves. We will do our best to keep you informed.

Who knows, but at least with the vaccines and greater knowledge of this coronavirus let us hope some more degrees of normality will return. This means that for those of us who operate commercial vehicles (private cars are exempt at present), unless your vehicle has a Euro6 designated engine, there will be a daily charge made to pass through the zone. Luckily two of our smaller coaches are Euro6, so no worries, but the larger coaches present a different scenario. Two of the vehicles are Euro5, there was no such thing as Euro6 when they were purchased new, and they still have a working life ahead of them, so what is the solution? They are having their exhaust systems upgraded to Euro6. This is not a cheap option, but at least grants are available to

That leaves just one to sort whose exhaust system cannot be upgraded, so maybe that coach will be off to pastures new.
